■ Introduction

Around 60 % of all domestic lemons are grown in Hiroshima Prefecture, making it the No. 1 growing region in Japan. Lemons were brought to the prefecture in 1898, and they have been cultivated for over 100 years. The region is ideal for growing lemons. Efforts are being made to grow safe and secure lemons without using preservatives or wax, allowing them to be eaten whole.

Characteristics

Hiroshima lemons are cultivated outdoors from October to April, kept in storage from May to June, then cultivated in greenhouses from July to September ensuring a year-round supply. Green lemons are shipped out between July and December, while yellow lemons are shipped out between January and June.

They have high sugar content and are characterized by mild acidity compared to imported lemons.

Packaging



Care taken to: Pack them into standardized boxes designed in the image of Hiroshima citrus fruit.



Recommended way of eating them

No preservatives or wax have been used, allowing them to be squeezed whole for their juice and fragrance.

Grown in the warm Setouchi climate, lemons were brought to Hiroshima in 1898 and they have since been cultivated for over a century. The island area allows the cultivation of lemons that are susceptible to cold snaps and strong typhoon winds, making it an ideal location in Japan for growing lemons.
